The voice belongs to Karen Matheson and is sampled (without permission) from Capercaillie's Ailein Duinn. The sample is transposed slightly up and down so that it sounds like two different voices. I played the samples using sample start modulation so that the voices "sing" different phrases.

Personal info: born 1963 in Osnabrück, Germany, and still living there. Changed from classical guitar to keyboards in 1985. Founded a band where I played keyboards for about seven years. Since 1993 I'm programming my music alone at home.

Allegoric Waters was created in 1997 when I was experimenting with world instruments samples. Nowadays I'm producing more experimental electronic music.
